OLD CUTLER DAYS

at the Charles Deering Estate



OLD CUTLER DAYS, the first annual History Fair and Seminole War Reenactment, will be held on April 24, 1988, from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., at the Charles Deering Estate, 16701 SW 72 Avenue, Miami, Florida.

The event will feature a reenactment of a skirmish from the Seminole Indian Wars. This will be Dade County's first public Seminole War reenactment. Living history demonstrations are now occurring with increasing frequency throughout Florida because 1988 is the 150th anniversary of many of the principal events that were part of the Second Seminole War. Military and Indian reenactors from across Florida will converge at the Charles Deering Estate Park for the event.

The history fair will feature artists, traditional craftsmen, and antique vendors, all exhibiting and selling their wares in South Florida's newest and most historical park.

Entertainment during the day will feature musical groups and vocalists who specialize in Florida lore and history.

Special guest artists will include Florida's "Barefoot Artist", Guy LaBree, regarded as one of the best painters of Seminole lifeways and myths. Other guest artists include sculptor Brad Cooley and Bahamian artist Alton Lowe, recently commissioned by the Bahamian government to paint a series on the Columbus landing.

The Sunday event will be kicked off with a costume ball Saturday evening at 7:30 p.m. held within the historical Charles Deering Mansion. The ball and dinner will feature 19th century dress and country cooking, and will be sponsored by the Archaeological and Historical Conservancy.

The Charles Deering Estate, maintained and operated by the Metro-Dade Park and Recreation Department, has 358 acres of natural pinewoods, hardwood hammock, and mangroves located directly on Biscayne Bay. The estate is the legacy of Charles Deering, an American industrialist who wintered in Dade County during the early twenties. The Estate includes archaeological and historic sites such as the 19th century town of Cutler and the original Cutler-Coconut Grove road. Nearby is the 10,000 year old Cutler Fossil site, location of the discovery of extinct bison and mammoths and the earliest human remains found in the Southeast United States.

Old Cutler Days is co-sponsored by the Archaeological and Historical Conservancy and Metro-Dade Park and Recreation Department.

Admission for the event is \$5.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children. Children under six are admitted free. Participation to the costume ball is \$18.00 per person. For further information call the event coordinator: Sue Koufakis (305) 891-4864.

In 1972, a group of citizens, realizing that precious few resources remained of Miami's early history, organized Dade Heritage Trust, as a not-for-profit organization. Today, Dade Heritage Trust is the county's largest historic preservation organization and works with preservationists throughout Dade County. Dade Heritage Trust fosters the preservation of the historic environment of Dade County and promotes a better understanding of its heritage. Membership to the trust is open to everyone interested in saving our historic structures, neighborhoods and districts. It includes a monthly newsletter; PRESERVATION TODAY, a preservation journal; frequent gatherings at historic sites; and invitations to special events.
