For over 28 years, Mario Ferrante has been studying, writing and lecturing on the cultural, anthropological and archaeological lifestyles of ancient civilizations as well as today's modern and primitive societies.

Mario Ferrante is the Curator of Collections of the South Florida Museum of Natural History (<a href="www.gravesmuseum.org">www.gravesmuseum.org</a>, 481 S. Federal Hwy, Dania Beach (formally the Graves Museum of Archaeology and Natural History), and a Professor of Cultural Geography at Miami-Dade Community College. He is a cultural historian, an explorer, world traveler and photographer. In his spare time Mario freelances for National Geographic and Epoca magazines.

This time Professor Ferrante will lecture and give a slide presentation on the Archaeology, Architecture, culture and history of the ancient city of Petra in Jordan.

Mario guarantees this lecture will be a dynamic, fun and above all, educational experience.


